As new materialism emerges from many disciplinary, cross-disciplinary, and theoretical sites, it is crucial to examine the ethical and political ramifications of its alliances and trajectories. This talk will critique the reinscription of Humanism within some materialist theories while proposing that new materialism align itself with posthumanism, the politics of intersectionality, and science studies.

Stacy Alaimo studied English and Interdisciplinary Critical Theory at the University of Illinois, Champaign-Urbana. Currently she is a faculty member at the University of Texas at Arlington. Her research interests include feminist theories about materialism, posthumanism and trans-corporeality, queer and postcolonial ecologies, and science studies. She is currently researching the science and politics of deep sea creatures referring, amongst others, to the works of Bruno Latour and Jacques Rancière.
